In the 2023 health rankings among North Carolina's 100 counties, Beaufort occupies the 76th position. This ranking situates Beaufort within the lowest quartile (0%-25%), signifying it as one of the least healthy counties in the state. This assessment is determined by current evaluations of both life expectancy and the quality of life in the county.







Medicaid

The Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) is a U.S. initiative providing low-cost health coverage to children in families with incomes too high for Medicaid. North Carolina's CHIP program is called NC Health Choice. On April 1, 2023, 55,000 children receiving NC Health Choice were moved to NC Medicaid. North Carolina joins 17 other states that have combined Medicaid/CHIP programs for children.




Drug Overdose Deaths, Beaufort County vs NC (Per 100,000 Residents)

Mental Health Data Report

This data compilation offers a comprehensive overview of recent patterns in visits to Emergency Departments (EDs) pertaining to specific mental health conditions.

Crude rates are computed by dividing the total count of ED visits by the population and then scaling by a factor of 10,000. Caution is advised when interpreting crude rates that are based on counts fewer than 10, as they may lack statistical robustness.






Beaufort County experienced notably higher crude rates of mental health conditions per 10,000 individuals compared to the averages observed across North Carolina. These differences in crude rates suggest that Beaufort County faces a heightened mental health burden compared to the broader North Carolina population. The elevated rates of anxiety, depression, suicidal ideation, and trauma/stress-related cases in the county indicate a potential need for increased mental health support and resources tailored to the local population. Further investigation into the underlying factors contributing to these discrepancies would provide valuable insights into the specific challenges faced by Beaufort County and enable more targeted interventions to address its unique mental health concerns.










Depression Trends: Beaufort

Annual Trends for Depression: Beaufort






Insurance Breakdown for Depression: Beaufort







Self-Inflicted Injury Trends: Beaufort








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


